CONVENTION PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT FOR JUNIORS

To be eligible to participate at the National Holstein Convention and in any Convention-sponsored or related activities, all Junior registrants must sign this Agreement and abide by the forms and rules included in this agreement. Failure to honor any one of these rules may subject registrant to immediate revocation of Convention participation and of the opportunity to participate in Convention-related or sponsored activities and events. The following rules apply to all Junior participants: 1. Participants must demonstrate good citizenship and adhere to the highest standards of conduct at all times. 2. No participant shall engage in any behavior prohibited by national, state or local laws. 3. At all Convention-related activities and events, including the time in transit, the rules of conduct specified by adult chaperones and advisors must be observed. 4. All participants acknowledge and accept the right of the host state Junior Program Committee and the board of directors of the host state and Holstein Association USA, Inc. and their staff, adult advisors and chaperones to establish and enforce rules for Convention participation and for all Convention-related activities and events. 5. For purposes of this Agreement, the Chairman of the host state Junior Program Committee shall have responsibility, with other representatives appointed by him/her or by the host State Association, to oversee the fair application and enforcement of the rules for Junior participants, in accordance with these procedures: a. Explain the alleged violation and present evidence of the violation to the reported violator. b. Provide the reported violator an opportunity to respond to the allegations. c. Therefore, it shall be the sole discretion of the representative group to decide if the allegations are substantiated and determine an appropriate penalty, which may include revocation of Convention participation privileges and a report of the violations to the National and State Associations. 6. Participant and his/her parents/guardians accept financial responsibility for the cost of the enforcement of the agreement and of any damage to persons or property caused by the participant. 7. The use or possession of any alcoholic beverage or controlled substance is STRICTLY PROHIBITED. 8. I have read and understand the rules and agreement above, and agree to accept and faithfully abide by them.

Wednesday, June 25

Deere and Dairy Tour \$30.00 per person

First stop will be Kass Antique Tractors, a private collection of Waterloo Boy and two-cylinder John Deere tractors, prairie tractors, Rumely Oil Pull tractors and stationery engines. Hansen's Dairy will offer a tour of their on-farm processing of fluid milk, hard ice cream, soft serve mix, cheese curds, butter and heavy cream. Lunch will be served at Hansen's. Next stop is a tour through the John Deere Tractor Plant in Waterloo. Attendees must be 13 years old or over to participate. Close toed shoes only on tour as sandals will not be permitted.

Luncheon for Juniors & Adults \$15.00 per person

The featured speaker will be Marshal Yanda, offensive lineman for the Baltimore Ravens and a 3x Pro Bowl selection. Marshal played football for the University of Iowa and was drafted by the Ravens in 2007. He will speak about growing up from a small town farm boy in Iowa to becoming one of the NFL's most dominant offensive linemen.

Junior Hoedown \$20.00 per person

Get out your cowboy hat, shine up your boots and head out to the barn for an exciting night of dancing, hayrides, campfire, s'mores, and a tasty Bar-B-Q meal. The hoedown will be held off site, and is sure to be one to remember.

Thursday, June 26

Tour #1: The Cream of the Crop \$30.00 per person

Start your tour off by visiting the world renowned Regancrest Farm. Plan to see members of the Dellia and Barbie families, as well as Opine-P and other polled families. After touring the 750-cow facility you will make your way to Moondale Farms, a 300-acre farm, home to 55 high type Registered Holsteins. Moondale currently has 29 EX and 19 VG cows with a BAA of 112.9. Next stop will be Henkeseen Holsteins, Henkeseen has several Red and White families, All-Iowa Winners, and Junior All-American nominees. Henkeseen focuses on homebred high type cows, and a majority of the cows trace back to the Hillary family. The final stop on the tour will be to Wesselcrest Holsteins. They installed two robotic milkers in 2011 and were recognized as the highest producing dairy per robot in the world in 2013. A buffet lunch will be provided.

Tour #2: For the Young At Heart \$30.00 per person

Visit the *Field of Dreams* movie site. The movie, released in 1989, was an Academy Award nominee for "Best Picture of the Year." Run the bases and hit a few baseballs with the "ghost" players. The National Farm Toy Museum houses thousands of toys, including favorite brands like John Deere, Case IH and Massey Ferguson. Next stop is at Le-O-La Holsteins for lunch. Le-O-La is home to many great cow families and focuses on breeding the best cows with show type and high genomics. The drive back to Dubuque stops at Reuter Dairy, an 850-cow herd 100 percent identified with a rolling herd average of 31,084M 3.9%F 1184F 3.2%P 970P and a SCC average of 75,000 for the past eight years. Finally, visit Farnear Holsteins, home of several high genomic daughters from the Barbie, Chief Adeen and Apple families.

Tour #3: Wine & Dine in the Scenic Hills of Iowa \$30.00 per person

The New Melleray Abbey is a Trappist monastery located in the rolling farmland south of Dubuque. The 30 monks support themselves by farming and making wooden caskets which are sold to the public. Breitbach's Country Dining is the oldest continuously operating restaurant and bar in Iowa, having been open since 1852. Savor a great meal along with spectacular scenery. Park Farm Winery, nestled in the rolling hills near Bankston, produces a wide variety of award winning wines that are unmatched in quality within the region.

Family Fun Night \$15.00 per person

Get ready to explore the Mighty Mississippi and all of the great rivers of America at the National Mississippi River Museum & Aquarium. This is an interactive museum where you can see the fish and wildlife that inhabit the Mississippi River. Enjoy the meal at the Convention Center and take a short walk or bus ride to the Museum, where you can enjoy an ice cream sundae.
