Judi Collinsworth Outstanding Junior Exhibitor Memorial Scholarship

The Judi Collinsworth Outstanding Junior Exhibitor Memorial Scholarship award recognizes National Junior Holstein Exhibitors for their efforts and interest in all aspects of the Holstein industry.

Award Background:

Judi Collinsworth worked at Holstein Association USA in Brattleboro, Vermont as Executive Director of Member and Industry Relations. She spent a great deal of time working to improve and expand the programs available to Holstein youth and was responsible for telemarketing, member-related programs, State Association communications, member services and Association external affairs.

General Guidelines:

- Recipients must be a National Junior Holstein member and must be enrolled in must be enrolled in a 2-year or 4-year accredited U.S. college or university by December 1.
- Youth must exhibit their animal at a National Junior Holstein Show during the current show season.
- Interested youth will be required to fill out an application to indicate their interest in being considered for this award. Applications are available online at www.holsteinusa.com/juniors.
- Applications are due December 1.
- Selection will be completed by an anonymous committee.

Selection Criteria:

LEADERSHIP PROFILE (Maximum 70 points possible)

Applicants must demonstrate responses that are well thought out, demonstrate leadership, depth of understanding, and their knowledge of the dairy industry by completing questions and writing a one-page essay.

- Submission of headshot photo and completion of contact information Earn 5 points
- What are your top three plans/goals within the Holstein industry Earn 25 points
- Essay response to most valuable lesson learned from showing Registered Holsteins Earn 40 points

HOLSTEIN PARTICIPATION (Maximum 20 points possible)

Applicants must illustrate their level of participation in Holstein activities on a local, county, area district, state, and national level.

• List your top ten involvements or accomplishments in Junior Holstein activities – Earn 20 points

OTHER PARTICIPATION (Maximum 10 points possible)

Applicants must illustrate their level of participation in 4-H, FFA, other dairy organizations, school, or community.

• List your top ten involvements or accomplishments in other activities – Earn 10 points

AWARD:

Award to be a \$1,000 scholarship to the top prize winner and a \$500 scholarship to the second prize winner. Youth will be eligible to receive prize money for this award only once.
